It mainly focuses on quality education and committed to nurture the student's talents with love and care, to raise the new generations as confident, versatile, productive and good citizen in alignment with Sustainable development goals and national policy on education



INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENTS



- ✓ The entire infrastructure was completed with 27 classrooms on the ground floor, first floor, and second floor.
- ✓ All classrooms are equipped with appropriate seating arrangement, smart boards, display boards, instructors' resource cupboards, and pigeon racks for students, in order to lessen their bag load.
- ✓ Completed the installation of required and relevant learning materials in the Composite lab, Computer lab, Math lab, and library.
- ✓ For the safety of kids, 42 security cameras were installed in and around the school
- ✓ Classrooms for dance, art, and music were set up with appropriate furniture and learning resources. We have trained teachers and professionals to integrate art into curriculum.
- ✓ An indoor and outdoor play area has been established for kindergarten and primary school pupils



Students can acquire physical education skills on a 200-meter track, a football field for 7s, and a standard basketball court, volley ball court and handball court.

A two-wheeler and four-wheeler parking area was set up next to the security barrier for parents to drop their children and employees to park their automobiles.

The programme is designed to suit the developmental and contextual needs of children through enabling environment. The above recognition is subject to the following conditions:-

- (1) The temporary recognition accorded to the school is valid upto 15.12.2023 and is to be renewed at an interval of every three years.
- (2) The grant of recognition is available initially for classes LKG to VIII Std and to be extended for Secondary / Senior Secondary Classes subsequently in due course of time.
- (3) The School shall abide by the provisions of the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009 and the Tamil Nadu Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Rules, 2011.
- (4) The School shall admit in pre-school / class I to the extent of 25% of the strength in each class, children belonging to Weaker Section and Disadvantaged Group in the neighborhood and provide free and compulsory elementary education till its completion.
- (5) The School shall maintain a separate bank account for the purpose of reimbursement.
- (6) The School shall not collect any capitation fee and subject the child or his or her parent or guardian to any screening procedure.
- (7) The School shall not deny admission to any child.
 - (a) for lack of age proof if such admission is sought subsequent to the extended period prescribed for admission.
 - (b) on the ground of religion, caste or race, place of birth or any of them.
- (8) The School shall ensure that,
 - (i) no child admitted shall be held back in any class or expelled from School till the completion of elementary education in a school.
 - (ii) no child shall be subjected to physical punishment or mental harassment.
 - (iii) no child is required to pass any board examination till the completion of elementary education.
 - (iv) every child completing elementary education shall be awarded a certificate as laid down under rule 21.
 - (v) inclusion of students with disabilities / special needs as per provision of the Act.
 - (vi) the teachers are recruited with minimum qualifications as laid down under section 23(1) of the Act.
 - (vii) Provided that the teachers who, at the commencement of this Act do not possess minimum qualifications shall acquire such minimum qualifications within a period of 5 years.
 - (viii) the teacher performs his duties specified under sub-section (1) of section 24 of the Act, and
 - (ix) the teacher shall not engage himself for private teaching activities.
- (9) The School shall follow the syllabus on the basis of curriculum laid down by appropriate authority.
- (10) The School shall maintain the standards and norms as specified in section 19 of the Act.
- (11) No unrecognized classes shall run within the premises of the school or outside in the name of School.

With reference to your application dated 18.01.2021 & 04.05.2021 and subsequent School Inspection in this regard, I hereby convey the grant of Recognition to them AGASTHYA VIDYA MANDIR, Agasthya Garden, Kothur Village, Hosur, Krishnagiri - 635 109 (Survey No.622/6A, 603/3,602/1,622/5,603/2, 605/2, 622/1,622/2,603/1,622/4 & 622/3) for Classes LKG to VIII Std for the period Upto 15.12.2023.

AVM Obtained recognition and No Objection Certificate by state government and we are in the process of CBSE affiliation.

School reopened physically on November 8th 2021 with covid 19 safety measures.

- G.Os: The school must have been approved by the current rules or for the purposes of education and skill development. Construction work within the compound should not be carried out in school working hours and safety measures in all respects are the whole responsibility of the management.
- (13) The School is run by a society registered under the Tamil Nadu Societies Registration Act, 1975 (Tamil Nadu Act 27 of 1975), or a public trust constituted under any law for the time being in force.
 - (14) The School is not run for profit to any individual, group or association of individuals or any other person.
 - (15) The accounts should be audited and certified by a Chartered Accountant and proper accounts statements should be prepared. A copy each of the Statements of Accounts should be sent every year to the competent authority granting recognition.
 - (16) The recognition Code Number shall be quoted for any correspondence with the competent authority.
 - (17) The School shall furnish such reports and information as may be required by the competent authority from time to time and shall comply with such instructions of the State Government or the competent authority as may be issued to secure the continued fulfillment of the condition of recognition or the removal of deficiencies in working of the School.
 - (18) Tamil shall be taught as a subject from Standards I to X in all schools notified under sub clause (iv) of clause (e) of section 2 of the Tamil Nadu Tamil Learning Act, 2006 (Tamil Nadu Act 13 of 2006) in a phased manner Commencing from the academic year 2015-2016 for standards I, from the Academic year 2016-2017 for standards I and II and shall be extended up to Standard X in a like manner as ordered in a reference (5) cited as follows.
 - (19) The school shall abide by the provisions of the Tamil Nadu Recognized Private Schools (Regulation) Act, 1973 and Tamil Nadu Recognized Private Schools (Regulation) Rules, 1974.
 - (20) The certificates of recognition issued by the department shall be subject to the fulfillment of deficiencies if any pointed out by the department at any stage/time.
 - (21) The management shall rectify the deficiencies pointed out in infrastructure or administration by the authorities.
 - (22) The Management shall apply for renewal of recognition three months before the expiry of this order to this Directorate through the Chief Educational Officer of the district concerned.
 - (23) The management shall follow the directions issued by the Government/Department from time to time keeping in view of the safety and security of the children and the overall administration of the School.
 - (24) The recognition shall be withdrawn if any contravention of the provisions of the Act, Rules or the conditions of recognition are found and proved.
 - (25) The School Management Shall have to full responsibility if any court case arise this regard. This order may be used only for the purpose of seeking affiliation to Central Board of Secondary Education as requested by the management and the management is not entitled to seek affiliation to any other Board.
